Chou Associates Management Inc. ("the Manager") manages the overall business of the Fund, including the selection of the securities in the Fund's portfolio and promoting sales of the Fund's units. For the purposes of this document, the terms Chou Associates Management Inc. and "the Manager" are interchangeable. Full contact information for the Manager is located at the end of this report.

Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Investment Objective and Strategies

Chou Associates Fund's (the "Fund") objective is to provide long-term growth of capital by investing primarily in equity securities of United States ("U.S.") and foreign businesses considered by Chou Associates Management Inc. (the "Manager") to be undervalued. The Fund may also invest in the equity securities of Canadian businesses. The Fund's investments may include common and preferred shares, convertible debentures, warrants, government and corporate bonds and short-term indebtedness.

The Fund's investment strategy follows a strong discipline with regard to the prices paid to acquire portfolio investments. The level of investments in a particular entity's securities is generally commensurate with the current price of the company's securities in relation to the Manager's assessment of such entity's intrinsic value as determined by various factors. This approach is designed to provide an extra margin of safety, which in turn, serves to reduce the Fund's overall portfolio risk.

Risk

The risks of investing in the Fund are disclosed in the Fund's most recently filed Simplified Prospectus which can be found on the Fund's website at www.sedar.com.

During the year ended December 31, 2016, there were no material changes that affected the Fund's overall level of risk.

As at December 31, 2016, Fairfax Financial Holdings held 24.0% of the units of the Fund. If Fairfax redeems its units, a significant portion of the Fund's investments may have to be liquidated in order to effect this transaction. The timing of such liquidation may not be appropriate and all investors may suffer a proportionate loss as a result of such liquidation.

Results of Operations

For the year ended December 31, 2016, the Fund decreased by 2.8% for Series A units and 2.2% for Series F units, after fees and expenses, while the S&P 500 Total Return Index increased by 8.9% in Canadian dollars. In U.S. dollars, the Fund increased by 0.2% for Series A units and 0.7% for Series F units, while the S&P 500 Total Return Index returned 12.0%.

Notwithstanding the political uncertainties, the U.S. stock market had a very good year in 2016. The market started soft in January and February with concerns of China's economic slowdown and prolonged declines in oil prices, but has quickly rebounded since then. The first political shocks came from the unexpected decision by British voters to leave the European Union in late June. News of Brexit sent the S&P 500 down 3.6% in just one day, as investors turned to safe haven assets like gold, which jumped over 4%. However, U.S. stocks quickly stabilized and coasted toward the November election. Despite the initial shock, the stock market reacted positively to Donald Trump winning the U.S. presidency as the Dow soared 257 points on election night. The rally was likely fuelled by expectations of lower taxes, reduced regulations, pro-business initiatives and stimulus fiscal spending on infrastructure. Industrial and financial stocks particularly benefited since the election with Trump calling for a reduction in former president Obama's expanded regulations on oil production and to scale back or even reverse financial regulations.

With employment and inflation rates steadily increasing in 2016, the Federal Reserve announced the second rate hike in a decade in December, increasing its benchmark rate a quarter percentage point. Expectations of further rate increases will potentially lead to higher borrowing costs for consumers and companies while incentivising more to save.

The biggest positive contributors to the Fund's performance in 2016 included JPMorgan Chase warrants expiring on October 2018, the equity securities of MBIA Inc., Overstock.com, Goldman Sachs Group, and the 2nd lien term loan of Exco Resources Inc.

Equities of Valeant Pharmaceuticals, Sears Holdings Corporation, Resolute Forest Products, and Nokia Corporation were the main negative contributors to the Fund's performance during the same period. The Canadian currency strengthened against the US dollar, which also negatively affected the Fund.

The Fund decreased its holdings of Berkshire Hathaway by 50%, and exited all shares of International Automotive Components Group.

New additions during the year include an equity stake in Valeant Pharmaceuticals, debt securities of Exco Resources unsecured 8.5% due April 2022, Westmoreland Coal Company 8.75% due January 2022, and preferred shares of Overstock.com. The Fund also increased its position in Sears Holdings Corporation and the 2nd lien term loan of Exco Resources.

In 2016, the Fund received \$3,195,369 in income from its securities lending program.

The Fund had no covered call options in its portfolio as at December 31, 2016.

The Fund did not enter into any foreign currency contracts during the year ended December 31, 2016.

The Fund's net redemptions for the year ended December 31, 2016 were approximately \$45,297,156 for Series A units and there were net purchases of \$736,318 for Series F units. The Fund's average month-end cash position for the year was 13.1% of the Fund's net assets.

Recent Developments

There have been no recent market developments of particular note, aside from the normal fluctuations of the markets that are expected to have an undue influence on the portfolio of the Fund when compared to its benchmark.

Related Party Transactions

The Manager manages the overall business of the Fund, including selection of the securities in the Fund's portfolio and promoting the sale of the Fund's units.

The Manager is also the trustee of the Fund. Investors receive units of a trust when they invest in the Fund. The Manager, as trustee, holds actual title to the property in the Fund, the cash and portfolio securities, on behalf of the Fund's investors.

The Manager, its officers and directors invest in units of the Fund from time to time in the normal course of business. All transactions with the Manager are measured at the exchange amounts.

During the year ended December 31, 2016, there were no transactions with related parties except in the capacities and instances set out above.

⁽⁵⁾ Management expense ratio ("MER") is based on total expenses (excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs) for the stated period and is expressed as an annualized percentage of weekly average net asset value during the period. The Manager may, at its discretion, waive or absorb certain operating expenses. MER includes the waiver or absorption by the Manager of certain operating expenses, while the MER before absorption shows the MER prior to operating expenses being waived or absorbed by the Manager.

⁽⁶⁾ The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of weekly average net asset value during the period.

⁽⁷⁾ The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio adviser manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher a fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the fund in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund.

⁽⁸⁾ Information from 2013 and thereafter is in accordance with IFRS. Information for years prior to 2013 is reported under Canadian GAAP.

Management Fees

The Manager manages the Fund. The Manager is entitled to an investment management fee calculated daily as a percentage of the market value of the net assets equal to 1.5% per annum for Series A units and 1.0% per annum for Series F units, payable monthly. The Manager pays 50 basis points per year trailer fees to dealers out of management fees for Series A units. There is no trailer fee paid out for Series F units.


General


Year-by-Year Returns

Annual Compound Returns

The following tables⁽¹⁾ show the annual compound total return for each of the Series A and Series F units of the Fund. The tables outline the Fund's past performance for the one-, three-, five-, ten-, fifteen- and twenty-year periods ended on December 31, 2016 for Series A units and since inception and for the one-, three-, five-and ten-year periods ended on December 31, 2016 for Series F units. Also shown for the same periods are the respective historical annual compound total returns or changes of the S&P 500 (the "Index"). The Index is based on the market capitalizations of 500 leading companies publicly traded in the U.S. stock market representing all major industries, as determined by Standard & Poor's. The Index is one of the most commonly followed equity indices and has been widely regarded as the best single gauge of the large cap U.S. equities market since the Index was first published in 1957. The benchmark Index is calculated without the deduction of management fees and fund expenses, whereas the performance of the Fund is calculated after deducting such fees and expenses.
