Chou Associates Management Inc. ("the Manager") manages the overall business of the Fund, including the selection of the securities in the Fund's portfolio and promoting sales of the Fund's units. For the purposes of this document, the terms Chou Associates Management Inc. and "the Manager" are interchangeable. Full contact information for the Manager is located at the end of this report.

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Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Investment Objective and Strategies

Chou Associates Fund's (the "Fund") objective is to provide long-term growth of capital by investing primarily in equity securities of the United States ("U.S.") and foreign businesses considered by Chou Associates Management Inc. (the "Manager") to be undervalued. The Fund may also invest in the equity securities of Canadian businesses. The Fund's investments may include common and preferred shares, convertible debentures, options, warrants, government and corporate bonds and short-term indebtedness.

The Fund's investment strategy follows a strong discipline with regard to the prices paid to acquire portfolio investments. The level of investment in a particular entity's securities is generally commensurate with the current price of the company's securities in relation to the Manager's assessment of such entity's intrinsic value as determined by various factors. This approach is designed to provide an extra margin of safety, which in turn, serves to reduce the Fund's overall portfolio risk.

Risk

The risks of investing in the Fund are disclosed in the Fund's most recently filed Simplified Prospectus which can be found on the Fund's website at www.choufunds.com and SEDAR at www.sedar.com.

During the first half of 2021, there were no material changes that affected the Fund's overall level of risk.

As at June 30, 2021, Fairfax Financial Holdings ("Fairfax") held 31.5% of the Series A units of the Fund. If Fairfax redeems its units, a significant portion of the Fund's investments may have to be liquidated in order to affect this transaction. The timing of such a liquidation may not be appropriate and all investors may suffer a proportionate loss as a result of such a liquidation.

Fairfax agreed in 2002 that it would not exercise any voting rights attached to units of the Fund or otherwise in any manner attempt to influence the affairs of the Chou Funds. This agreement remains in full force and effect and has been complied with by Fairfax to date.

Market Review

For the first six months of 2021, U.S. equities performed positively. The S&P 500 was up 15.2%, led by the energy, financial and real estate sectors. The performance ranked as the second-best performance for the first half of a year since 1998, during the dot-com boom.

With the approval of three vaccines in the U.S., the market advanced in anticipation of a strong economic rebound as economies around the world began reopening from strict lockdowns imposed to battle the COVID-19 pandemic. Amid continued stimulus from the U.S. government, one measure of inflation, the consumer price index (CPI), increased by 5.4% in June 2021 from the previous year, the highest level since 2008, and well above the U.S. Federal Reserve's 2% target.

The U.S. Federal Open Market Committee held four scheduled meetings during the first six months of 2021. The Committee decided to keep the target range for the federal funds rate at 0 to 0.25 percent and expects it will stay until the labor market improves. While inflation has been rising faster than they expected, they noted at their June meeting that they see the current trend as transitory.

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Results of Operations

For the period ended June 30, 2021, the Fund increased 37.6% for Series A units and 37.9% for Series F units, after fees and expenses, while the S&P 500 Total Return Index returned 12.0% in Canadian dollars. In U.S. dollars, the Fund increased 41.3% for Series A units and 41.6% for Series F units, while the S&P 500 Total Return Index increased 15.2%.

The major advancers in the period were the equity holdings of Resolute Forest Products Inc., MBIA Inc., Overstock.com and Wells Fargo & Company.

The Canadian currency appreciated against the US dollar, which also negatively affected the Fund.

Portfolio Update

During the period, the Fund reduced its holdings in The Goldman Sachs Group Inc., Resolute Forest Products Inc., Wells Fargo & Company and Citigroup Inc. The Fund also sold off its holdings in DaVita Inc.

The Fund did not make any new investments or enter into any foreign currency contracts during the period ended June 30, 2021. The Fund sold a few covered call options on the equity holdings of Resolute Forest Products Inc., MBIA Inc., and Bausch Health Companies Inc. during the period ending June 30, 2021.

In the first half of 2021, the Fund received \$3,132 in income from its securities lending program.

The Fund's net redemptions for the period ended June 30, 2021 were approximately \$11,391,825 for Series A units and approximately \$6,168,875 for Series F units. The Fund's average month-end cash position for the period was 1.0% of the Fund's net assets.

Recent Developments

The ongoing COVID-19 pandemic has continued to disrupt businesses around the world. Uneven vaccination rollouts and the emergence of new variants have added volatility to both domestic and international markets.

While governments and central banks have maintained their support of the economy through monetary and fiscal policies, the shape of the pandemic recovery remains unclear at this time.

Based on this increased uncertainty, we expect the performance of the Fund's portfolio to be affected to some degree in the near term.

Related Party Transactions

The Manager manages the overall business of the Fund, including selection of the securities in the Fund's portfolio and promoting the sale of the Fund's units.

The Manager is also the trustee of the Fund. Investors receive units of a trust when they invest in the Fund. The Manager, as trustee, holds the actual title to the property in the Fund, the cash and portfolio securities, on behalf of the Fund's investors.

The Manager, its officers and directors invest in units of the Fund from time to time in the normal course of business. As of June 30, 2021, the Manager, its officers and directors hold 5.5% of the Series A units of the Fund. All transactions with the Manager are carried out at the Fund's net asset value as at the transaction date.

During the period ended June 30, 2021, there were no transactions with related parties except in the capacities and instances set out above.

(3) Distributions were reinvested in additional units of the Fund or paid in cash upon request.

(4) This information is provided as at the period end shown and is rounded to the nearest thousand.

(5) Management expense ratio ("MER") is based on total expenses (excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs) for the stated period and is expressed as an annualized percentage of weekly average net asset value during the period. The Manager may, at its discretion, waive or absorb certain operating expenses. MER includes the waiver or absorption by the Manager of certain operating expenses, while the MER before absorption shows the MER prior to operating expenses being waived or absorbed by the Manager.

(6) The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of weekly average net asset value during the period.

(7) The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio adviser manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the financial period. The higher a fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the fund in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund.

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Management Fees

The Manager manages the Fund. The Manager is entitled to an investment management fee calculated daily as a percentage of the market value of the net assets equal to 1.5% per annum for Series A units and 1.0% per annum for Series F units, payable monthly. The Manager pays 50 basis points per year trailer fees to dealers out of management fees for Series A units. There is no trailer fee paid out for Series F units.

Past Performance

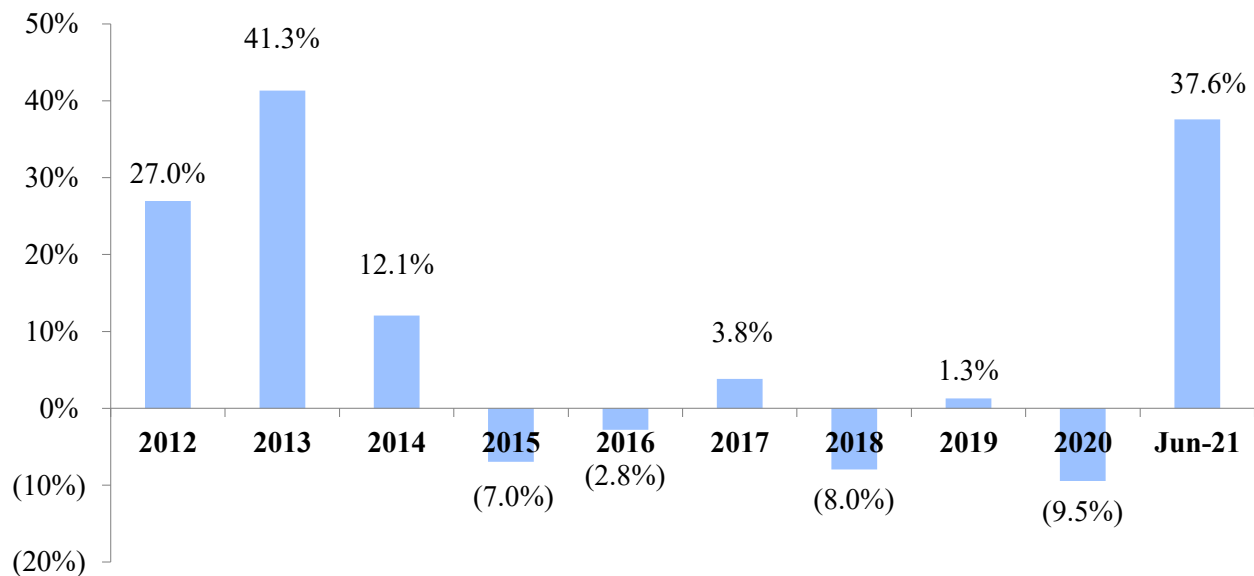
General

Year-by-Year Returns

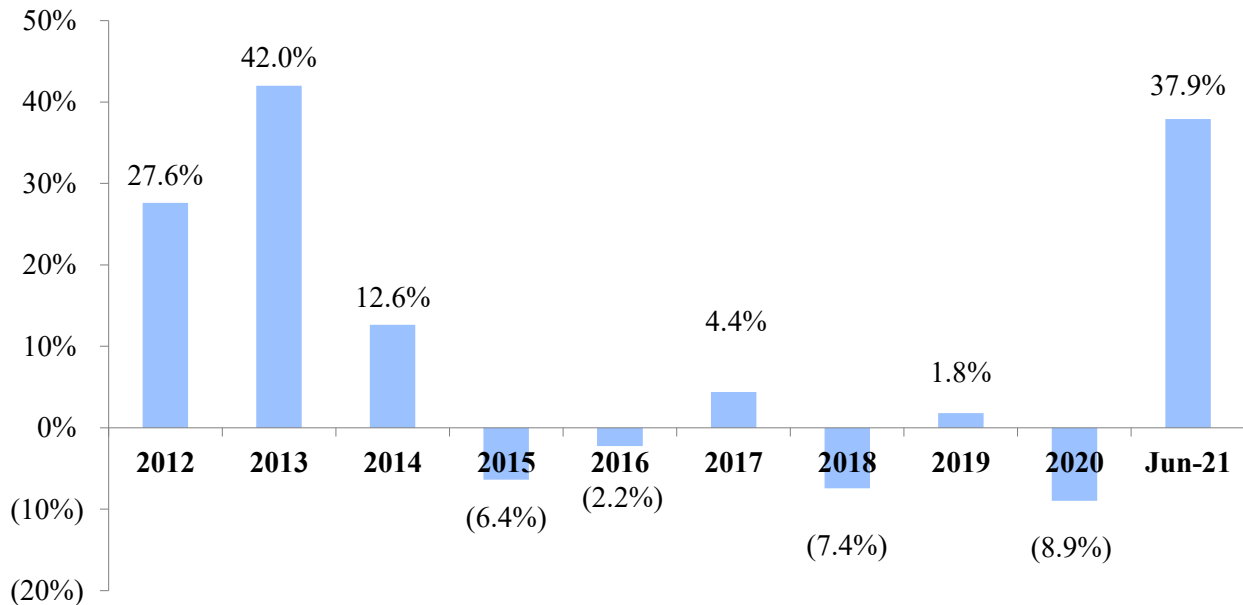

Annual Compound Returns

The following tables⁽¹⁾ show the annual compound total return for each of the Series A and Series F units of the Fund. The tables outline the Fund's past performance for the one-, three-, five-, ten-, and fifteen-year periods ended on June 30, 2021 for Series A units and for the one-, three-, five-, ten-, and fifteen-year periods ended on June 30, 2021 for Series F units. Also shown for the same periods are the respective historical annual compound total returns of the S&P 500 (the "Index"). The Index is based on the market capitalization of 500 leading companies publicly traded in the U.S. stock market representing all major industries, as determined by Standard & Poor's. The Index is one of the most commonly followed equity indices and has been widely regarded as the best single gauge of the large cap U.S. equities market since the Index was first published in 1957. The benchmark Index is calculated without the deduction of management fees and fund expenses, whereas the performance of the Fund is calculated after deducting such fees and expenses.
