For the purposes of this document, the terms Chou Associates Management Inc. and "the Manager" are interchangeable. Full contact information for the Manager is located at the end of this report.

Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Investment Objective and Strategies

Chou Associates Fund's (the "Fund") objective is to provide long-term growth of capital by investing primarily in equity securities of the United States ("U.S.") and foreign businesses considered by Chou Associates Management Inc. (the "Manager") to be undervalued. The Fund may also invest in the equity securities of Canadian businesses. The Fund's investments may include common and preferred shares, convertible debentures, options, warrants, government and corporate bonds and short-term indebtedness. The Fund may also use derivatives such as, but not limited to, futures, options, swaps and forward contracts to gain exposure to securities and asset classes consistent with the objectives of the Fund, and to hedge portfolio exposure against losses from foreign currency and domestic currency exposure and changes in securities prices.

The Fund's investment strategy follows a strong discipline with regard to the prices paid to acquire portfolio investments. The level of investment in a particular entity's securities is generally commensurate with the current price of the company's securities in relation to the Manager's assessment of such entity's intrinsic value as determined by various factors. This approach is designed to provide an extra margin of safety, which in turn, serves to reduce the Fund's overall portfolio risk.

Risk

The risks of investing in the Fund are disclosed in the Fund's most recently filed Simplified Prospectus which can be found on the Fund's website at www.choufunds.com and SEDAR+ at www.sedarplus.ca.

As at June 30, 2025, Fairfax Financial Holdings ("Fairfax") held 18.1% of the total outstanding units of the Fund. If Fairfax redeems its units, a significant portion of the Fund's investments may have to be liquidated in order to execute this transaction. The timing of such a liquidation may not be appropriate and all investors may suffer a proportionate loss as a result of such a liquidation. Fairfax agreed in 2002 that it would not exercise any voting rights attached to units of the Fund or otherwise in any manner attempt to influence the affairs of the Chou Funds. This agreement remains in full force and effect and has been complied with by Fairfax to date.

Market Review

For the first six months of 2025, the U.S. market, as measured by the S&P 500, gained 6.2% in U.S. dollar terms, despite navigating one of the most turbulent stretches in recent years. A sharp selloff in April followed the announcement of new tariffs, which rattled investor confidence and raised fears of an economic slowdown. Markets rebounded swiftly, supported by postponed tariff implementation and easing trade tensions, pushing major indices to record highs by late June. Tech and Al-focused giants led the way, while Industrials and Financials delivered strong performance. The Federal Reserve held interest rates steady at 4.25-4.50% but signaled the possibility of two cuts later in the year. Markets responded favorably to the Federal Reserve's accommodative stance, combined with signs of easing inflation amid a resilient labor market.

Results of Operations

For the six-month period ended June 30, 2025, the Fund decreased 0.5% for Series A units and 0.2% for Series F units, after fees and expenses, while the S&P 500 Total Return Index increased 0.6% in Canadian dollars. In U.S. dollars, the Fund increased 5.1% for Series A units and 5.4% for Series F units, while the S&P 500 Total Return Index increased 6.2%.

The top gainers in the first half of 2025 were the warrants of Hertz Global Holdings Inc. and the equity holdings of Citigroup Inc., Wells Fargo & Company and Berkshire Hathaway Inc.

The Canadian currency appreciated against the US dollar, which also negatively affected the Fund.

Portfolio Update

In March 2025, Occidental Petroleum temporarily reduced the exercise price from \$22.00 to \$21.30 per warrant as part of a normal tender offer for earlier conversion. We took up the offer and converted the warrants to equivalent shares of Occidental Petroleum.

The Fund initiated investments in the equity holding of General Motors Company.

In the first half of 2025, the Fund received \$28,149 in income from its securities lending program.

The Fund's net redemptions for the period ended June 30, 2025 were approximately \$2,344,642 for Series A units and the Fund's net redemptions were approximately \$722,716 for Series F units. Out of the net redemptions for Series F units, \$260,900 was switched from Series A units following the Order Execution Only ("OEO") trailer ban. The Fund's average month-end cash position for the period was 23.4% of the Fund's net assets.

Recent Developments

U.S. markets experienced heightened volatility in response to newly imposed tariffs, leading to a sharp sell-off in April before recovering swiftly to reach record highs. Elevated margin debt levels point to increased speculation and potential overheating within the market. Globally, rising oil prices and ongoing trade tensions have weighed on emerging economies. As a result, we anticipate some impacts on the portfolio performance of the Fund in the near term.

Related Party Transactions

The Manager manages the overall business of the Fund, including selection of the securities in the Fund's portfolio and promoting the sale of the Fund's units. The Manager is also the trustee of the Fund. Investors receive units of a trust when they invest in the Fund. The Manager, as trustee, holds the actual title to the property in the Fund, the cash and portfolio securities, on behalf of the Fund's investors.

The Manager, its officers and directors invest in units of the Fund from time to time in the normal course of business. As of June 30, 2025, the Manager, its officers and directors hold 8.3% of the total outstanding units of the Fund. All transactions with the Manager are carried out at the Fund's net asset value as at the transaction date. During the year, there were no transactions with related parties except in the capacities and instances set out above.

⁽⁵⁾ Management expense ratio ("MER") is based on total expenses (excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs) for the stated period and is expressed as an annualized percentage of weekly average net asset value during the period. The Manager may, at its discretion, waive or absorb certain operating expenses. MER includes the waiver or absorption by the Manager of certain operating expenses, while the MER before absorption shows the MER prior to operating expenses being waived or absorbed by the Manager.

⁽⁶⁾ The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of weekly average net asset value during the period.

⁽⁷⁾ The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio adviser manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the financial period. The higher a fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the fund in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund.

Management Fees

The Manager manages the Fund. The Manager is entitled to an investment management fee calculated daily as a percentage of the market value of the net assets equal to 1.5% per annum for Series A units and 1.0% per annum for Series F units, payable monthly. The Manager pays 50 basis points per year trailer fees to dealers out of management fees for Series A units. There is no trailer fee paid out for Series F units.

Past Performance


General


Year-by-Year Returns

Annual Compound Returns

The following tables⁽¹⁾ show the annual compound total return for each of the Series A and Series F units of the Fund. The tables outline the Fund's past performance for the one-, three-, five-, ten-, and fifteen-year periods ended on June 30, 2025. Also shown for the same periods are the respective historical annual compound total returns of the S&P 500 (the "Index"). The Index is based on the market capitalization of 500 leading companies publicly traded in the U.S. stock market representing all major industries, as determined by Standard & Poor's. The Index is one of the most commonly followed equity indices and has been widely regarded as the best single gauge of the large cap U.S. equities market since the Index was first published in 1957. The benchmark Index is calculated without the deduction of management fees and fund expenses, whereas the performance of the Fund is calculated after deducting such fees and expenses.
