Chou Associates Management Inc. ("the Manager") manages the overall business of the Fund, including the selection of the securities in the Fund's portfolio and promoting sales of the Fund's units. For the purposes of this document, the terms Chou Associates Management Inc. and "the Manager" are interchangeable. Full contact information for the Manager is located at the end of this report.

Management Discussion of Fund Performance

Investment Objective and Strategies

Chou Bond Fund's (the "Fund") objective is to provide conservation of principal and income production with capital appreciation as a secondary consideration. The Fund invests primarily in Canadian and U.S. fixed income instruments considered by Chou Associates Management Inc. (the "Manager") to be undervalued. These bonds include, but are not limited to, Government of Canada, provincial, municipal and corporate issues, including convertibles and high yield bonds. Investments may be made in bonds outside of Canada and the U.S. The Fund may also use derivatives such as, but not limited to, futures, options, swaps and forward contracts to gain exposure to securities and asset classes consistent with the objectives of the Fund, and to hedge portfolio exposure against losses from foreign currency and domestic currency exposure and changes in securities prices.

Risk

The risks of investing in the Fund are disclosed in the Fund's most recently filed Simplified Prospectus which can be found on the Fund's website at www.choufunds.com and SEDAR+ at www.sedarplus.ca.

During the period ended June 30, 2025, there were no material changes that affected the Fund's overall level of risk.

Market Review

For the first six months of 2025, the Bloomberg Barclays U.S. Corporate High Yield index, delivered a positive return of 4.6% in US dollars, driven by declining yields, steady credit fundamentals, and strong investor demand. Credit spreads tightened notably in May, narrowing by 61 basis points to 363 bps, while yields fell to around 7.8%. Lower-rated CCC bonds outperformed their BB and B counterparts. New issuance rebounded in the second quarter, reaching \$123.9 billion, with a clear shift toward higher-quality, senior-secured deals. Default rates remained low at about 1.4%, well below historical averages, supported by stable corporate fundamentals.

Results of Operations

For the period ended June 30, 2025, the Fund increased by 0.3% for Series A units and 0.4% for Series F units after fees and expenses, while Barclays Capital U.S. Corporate High Yield Index decreased 0.8% in Canadian dollars. In U.S. dollars, the Fund increased 5.9% for Series A units and 6.0% for Series F units, while Barclays Capital U.S. Corporate High Yield Index increased 4.6%.

The top gainers in the first half of 2025 were the debt holding of Bausch Health Companies Inc., 11.000% due September 30, 2028. and the equity holding of EXCO Resources Inc.

The major underperformers in the period were the debt holding of Avation Capital SA, 8.25% due October 31, 2026 and Bausch Health Companies Inc., 14.000% due October 15, 2030.

The Canadian currency appreciated against the US dollar, which also negatively affected the Fund.

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Portfolio Update

The Fund initiated investments in the debt holdings of Strathcona Resources Limited., 6.875% due August 1, 2026 and Allegiant Travel Company, 7.250% due August 15, 2027. The fund also initiated investments in the preferred shares of Enbridge Inc. Series 3.

The Fund sold the preferred shares of B Riley Financial Inc. and the debt holding of 1375209 BC Limited., 9.000% due January 30, 2028.

In the first half of 2025, the Fund received \$1,114 in income from its securities lending program.

The Fund did not enter into any foreign currency contracts in the first half of 2025.

The Fund's net subscriptions for the period ended June 30, 2025 were approximately \$39,244 for Series A units and approximately \$1,689,667 for Series F units. Out of the net purchases for Series F units, \$1,203 was switched from Series A units following the Order Execution Only ("OEO") trailer ban. The Fund's average month-end cash and cash equivalent position for the period was 57.0% of the Fund's net assets.

Recent Developments

U.S. markets experienced heightened volatility in response to newly imposed tariffs, leading to a sharp sell-off in April before recovering swiftly to reach record highs. Elevated margin debt levels point to increased speculation and potential overheating within the market. Globally, rising oil prices and ongoing trade tensions have weighed on emerging economies. As a result, we anticipate some impacts on the portfolio performance of the Fund in the near term.

Related Party Transactions

The Manager manages the overall business of the Fund, including selection of the securities in the Fund's portfolio, and promoting the sale of the Fund's units.

The Manager is also the trustee of the Fund. Investors receive units of a trust when they invest in the Fund. The Manager, as trustee, holds the actual title to the property in the Fund, the cash and portfolio securities, on behalf of the Fund's investors.

The Manager, its officers and directors invest in units of the Fund from time to time in the normal course of business. As of June 30, 2025, the Manager, its officers and directors do not hold any units of the Fund. All transactions with the Manager are carried out at the Fund's net asset value as at the transaction date.

During the period ended June 30, 2025, there were no transactions with related parties except in the capacities and instances set out above.

(⁴) This information is provided as at the period end shown and is rounded to the nearest thousand.

(⁵) Management expense ratio ("MER") is based on total expenses (excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs) for the stated period and is expressed as an annualized percentage of weekly average net asset value during the period. The Manager may, at its discretion, waive or absorb certain operating expenses. MER includes the waiver or absorption by the Manager of certain operating expenses, while the MER before absorption shows the MER prior to operating expenses being waived or absorbed by the Manager.

(⁶) The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of weekly average net asset value during the period.

(⁷) The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio adviser manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the financial period. The higher a fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the fund in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund.

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Management Fees

The Manager manages the Fund. The Manager is entitled to an investment management fee calculated daily as a percentage of the market value of the net assets equal to 1.15% per annum for Series A units and 1.0% per annum for Series F units, payable monthly. The Manager pays 15 basis points per year trailer fees to dealers out of management fees for Series A units. There is no trailer fee paid out for Series F units.

Past Performance


General

Year-by-Year Returns



Annual Compound Returns

The tables outline the Fund's past performance for the one-, three-, five-, ten-, and fifteen-year periods ended on June 30, 2025. Also shown for the same periods are the respective historical annual compound total returns of the Barclays U.S. Corporate High Yield Index (the "Index"). The Index is a broad-based benchmark that measures the non-investment grade, fixed-rate, corporate bond market. It includes \$U.S.-denominated securities publicly issued by U.S. and non-U.S. industrial, utility and financial issuers that meet specified maturity, liquidity, and quality requirements. The Index is calculated without the deduction of management fees and fund expenses, whereas the performance of the Fund is calculated after deducting such fees and expenses.
